Focus:

First-hand experience of several of the Scouting-recognized paths to Duty to God and Reverence

Foster mutual respect, tolerance for diversity, and curiosity among Scouts for the many religions recognized by Scouting America (39) for the purpose of religious emblems

Show consistencies among religions, so Scouts will come to identify, accept and respect each as paths to God and holiness - also show differences among religions that make each unique and special to their adherents

Allow Scouts to observe and experience worship practices and services of each religion, preceded or followed by explanations of the religious practices the scouts observed and themed discussion: *religious values of and consistent with the Ten Commandments*

For Abrahamic faiths – discuss one or two of the Ten Commandments; for non-Abrahamic faiths – discuss universal key values and ethical principles of your faith that are consistent with the Ten Commandments
