

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CAMP INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

The Heart of America Council provides program, facilities, and services without regard to race, color, national origin, age, gender, or handicap.

- ❖ All adult leaders and youth on the reservation must be current registered members in the Boy Scouts of America.
- ❖ No camper, youth or adult, will be permitted to stay in camp unless the full camp fees have been paid prior to the start of the camp session.
- ❖ Any Scout or leader with special needs that require addressing at camp should inform the director no later than June 15, 2013 by completing the Special Needs Request Form, which is included as part of this packet. Please be sure to indicate type of need, i.e. physical, medical, dietary, food allergies, etc.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Registrations and fee payment of \$125 per camper, must be postmarked or hand-delivered to the Council Service Center by Wednesday, May 23, 2013. After that date the cost is \$140.00 per camper.

CAMP FEES

Youth Fee - \$125.00 Adult Fee* - \$125.00 Provisional Camper Fee*-\$125.00

These fees are for a full time camper staying for the entire session. Fee includes 1 T-shirt.

*A provisional camper is a youth attending camp without their Crew's adult leader(s).

- ❖ Part-time Camper - \$30.00 per day.
- ❖ At 3 days, the camper will be considered full time and will pay the full camp fee.
- ❖ Part-time campers must have all forms filled out the same as full time.
- ❖ Check in or out at the Venturing Camp office will be required when arriving/departing camp.
- ❖ Adults will be asked to help staff in the program areas .
- ❖ Youth crews will assist in setup and cleanup before and after meals.

BSA LEADERSHIP POLICY

BSA policy states that two adult leaders are required for all Scouting trips, they must be trained in Youth Protection. At least one female and one male adult leader is required for coed groups. Both leaders must be a minimum of 21 years of age. If you are unable to have two leaders with your unit during the camp, you must contact the Director prior to June 1, 2012 to arrange for the proper number of adults.

TOUR PERMITS

Local Tour permits are not required when a unit has is attending in their council and is pre-registered. If you are an out of Council Unit, a Local Tour Permit may be filed on-line at 2 weeks before camp. <http://www.scouting.org/filestore/pdf/680-014.pdf> If you are traveling farther than 500 miles, than a National Tour Permit must be filed 4 weeks before camp.

TRANSPORTATION

- PADI Scuba Forms**-if you are planning on participating in the SCUBA experience, you must have these forms completed and signed.

SPEED LIMIT

The maximum speed limit for all vehicles at camp is 15 miles per hour. No driving off of roads is permitted, and all vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas. Absolutely no vehicles of any kind are allowed in the campsites. The Heart of America Council is not responsible for loss or damage caused by fire, storms, theft, or vandalism to any personal vehicles, or for any loss or damage to articles left in said vehicles.

REFUND POLICY

- A unit is expected to pay for the number of campers and leaders at the final fee payment date for their camp. **No refunds will be granted after the final fee payment date, however, transfers within the unit will be allowed.** We understand that certain circumstances do arise that may result in a camper not being able to attend camp at the last minute. For a refund after the final fee payment date, a letter requesting a refund and explaining the extenuating circumstances must be sent to the Camping Committee of the Heart of America Council within two weeks of the end of your camping session. - Any request concerning a medical illness of a Scout or Leader must be accompanied by a signed doctor's statement. Refunds will not be considered for change of mind, vacation plans, extended sports schedules, weather or no shows. The Camping Committee will review all requests and their decisions will be final.
- If a Venturer or leader becomes ill while attending camp and is sent home by the camp medical staff, they are eligible for a pro-rated refund (by day) of the "balance of fee." (\$50 deposit is non-refundable.) **If a camper leaves without being sent home by the camp medical staff, there is NO refund.**

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CAMP INFORMATION

CHECK IN PROCEDURE

- × Check in location is in the Venturing Camp Office in North Camp/Cub World
- × Bring all forms...Health forms,/rosters/Discover Scuba forms
- × Registration in BSA will be verified

WRISTBANDS

- × Wristbands designating you as a camper will be handed out during registration. Camper registration wristbands must be worn at all times.
- × Swimmers must wear appropriate swimmer wristbands designated by the swim test, to all water sport activities.

VISITORS

- × All visitors must check in at the camp office and are required to wear the assigned visitor wristband while on Camp property.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURE

- × Early departures are permitted. Permission from Leader is required as well as signing out at Venturing Camp office is also required.
- × When leaving camp at any time, all individuals **must sign out** at the Venturing Camp Office
- × If leaving camp with no intention of returning, Camp Staff will check the tent areas. Advisor will sign off that all is clean and in good shape.
- × All fees need to be settled prior to departure.
- × Youth and leaders pick up personal health forms in office before leaving camp.

WATER SPORTS

- **SCUBA**-participants must have the completed PADI forms located in this guidebook.
- **SWIM TEST**-All campers, youth and adult, must present themselves to the swimming pool for a swimming test. Anyone unable to pass the test or unwilling to take the test will be limited to the shallow end of the swimming pool and will be unable to participate in any waterfront activities.

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CAMP INFORMATION

FIRST AID

- There will be a certified Health Officer on the premises in case of an emergency. The Crew Advisor should handle minor first aid.



PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

- All prescription drugs must be in the original container that the prescription was filled...prescriptions are turned over to the health officer for keeping and dispensing. Over the counter medication (i.e. Benedryl, aspirin, etc.) shall be marked with participant's name and turned over to their Advisor to be dispensed as needed. All medications are to remain locked until dispensing. There are facilities for refrigerating medication if needed.



EMERGENCY PROCEDURES AT CAMP

There is **no** electrical power in the tent areas. **Open Flames are not allowed in tents.**

- The Venturing Camp trading post will be open at posted times during Camp. It is suggested that Venturers bring spending money to camp. The Central Camp Naish Reservation Trading Post will also be open and is a full service Scout Shop.
- Optional items: costumes, accessories & props for the theme nights, Iron Chef decorations. Musical Instruments, small rug for tent.
- The Trading Post is stocked with various snacks, souvenirs, t-shirts, books and patches. The trading post will be open during scheduled free time. Be sure to check the posted schedule.
- **The Naish Scout Reservation is not responsible for securing or for the loss of personal items. It is your responsibility to keep track of all personal valuables while at camp.**

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
WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP

- ✓ Saws
- ✓ Personal Tents
- ✓ Stove or Fueled Lanterns (battery operated only)
- ✓ Food in Campsite
- ✓ Sheath Knives
- ✓ Axes
- ✓ Awnings or Rain Flies
- ✓ Sandals/Flip-Flops only at pool, showers or tents
- ✓ (To keep animals out of tents, food should not be brought into campsites. Extra food should be stored in vehicles and consumed in shelters only.)



PETS

Pets are not allowed on the Reservation property.



FIREWORKS

Fireworks are not permitted at camp. Fireworks will be confiscated and destroyed by the local fire marshal. Please make sure that no one brings fireworks to camp.

FIREARMS AND WEAPONS

Personal firearms, archery equipment, and sheath knives are not allowed in any area of camp including the archery and rifle ranges or the program areas. If brought to camp, these items must be turned into the Reservation Director until the unit checks out at the end of the camp session. Please insure that this type of personal equipment is left at home, and not brought to camp.



HAMMOCKS & PERSONAL TENTS

Due to past injuries to campers, hammocks are not permitted at camp. Also personal tents are not permitted at camp. Naish Scout Reservation will provide tents, platforms and plenty of shade for all campers.

TOBACCO PRODUCTS

Use of tobacco products by anyone under the age of 21 is NOT allowed. Use of tobacco in program areas, trails, and campsites is prohibited. Adults will only use tobacco in DESIGNATED areas and not in front of those under 21 years of age.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES & NARCOTIC DRUGS

The Heart of America Council will not tolerate the presence of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, drugs, or persons obviously under the influence of same, at any of our council camps. Violators will be asked to leave camp immediately. **Leaders are expected to set an example for their youth to follow.**

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CONSERVATION POLICIES

- Do not cut down any trees.
- Do not hike trails that are marked "Closed" and do not cut across switchbacks.
- Only conduct conservation projects that have approval of the Camp Management.
- No fires in campsites or tents.
- Please leave your campsite cleaner than you found it.
- Please pick-up any trash you find along camp trails.

SOME GENERAL SAFETY TIPS

- Always hike and bike in groups of three or more.
- Wear shoes at all times to prevent cuts and bruises.
- No Sandals or open-toed shoes.
- Keep the shower house, bathrooms and campsite areas clean and free from hazards.
- Place trash in waste receptacles.
- No camper's pets are allowed on the reservation.
- No running in camp.
- No rock throwing.



CAMP DRESS CODE

- **UNIFORMS:** Individual Crews will determine their own uniform requirements. Please remember this is a Boy Scout Camp and adults and youth are expected to use good judgment in what they wear. Clothes that are appropriate and in good taste should be worn.
- We encourage the wearing of the traditional Venturing Uniform.
- **SHOES:** No open-toed shoes should be worn anywhere on the reservation except the pool areas and showers.
- **SWIMSUITS:** One-piece swimsuits only. Swimsuits should be worn only in the pool areas. Swimsuits should be covered when not in the pool area.
- **CLOTHING:** The following are examples of clothing that is inappropriate: anything advertising illegal content, tobacco, alcohol, obscene, suggestive, or violence, or that may be interpreted as such. No see-through or revealing tops or bottoms. The dress code will be enforced.



VENTURING CAMP

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The Theodore Naish Scout Reservation Cub World is located 5 miles from the junction of I-435 and K-32. The address of the reservation is 1100 Martinek Lane, Kansas City, Kansas 66111. The Naish Scout Reservation is between K-7 and 435, and North of K-32.

- **From 435:** Take 435, to K-32 (K-32 exit is South of the I-70/Legends interchange). Exit K-32 and go WEST (right) on K-32 to 121st Street. Turn North (RIGHT) on 121st Street and follow the winding road to the entrance of Naish Scout Reservation. **Go PAST the entrance to Naish and go into North Camp (Cub World) and park vehicles.**
- **From K-7.** Go NORTH on K-7 to the K-7/K-32 Junction. Go EAST on K-32 to 121st Street. Turn LEFT on 121st Street and follow the winding road to the entrance of Naish Scout Reservation. **Go PAST the entrance to Naish and go into North Camp (Cub World) and park vehicles.**
