Webelos/AOL at Bartle

The Heart of America Council provides program facilities and services to youth members without regard to race, color, national origin, age, gender, or handicap.

The H. Roe Bartle Scout Reservation, located near Osceola, Missouri, is home to thousands of Scouts and Leaders each summer. The 4,200-acre reservation consists of three camps: Lone Star, Sawmill, and Piercing Arrow. The H. Roe Bartle Scout Reservation has been a summer home to Scouting and the Tribe of Micosay since 1930.

Our staff is committed to serving you to the best of our ability.

To fulfill that commitment, the Webelos/AOL Adventures Weekend features skilled, enthusiastic staff and activities that introduce Webelos Scouts to the Scouts BSA program and support their journey on the Trail to Eagle.

The Webelos/AOL Adventures Weekend at Bartle introduces Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts to the H. Roe Bartle Scout Reservation, the Micosay Honor Camping program, Camp Piercing Arrow, and the activity-and adventure-based programs offered during the weekend.

Participation

The 2026 Webelos/AOL Adventures Weekend is open to registered Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts (fourth and fifth graders), their registered leaders, and a parent or legal guardian. Scouts may attend individually with a parent or guardian, but siblings may not attend. Full dens are welcome and encouraged to register and arrive together when possible. You are also welcome to bring Pack or Den flags to display at your campsite. Den Chiefs are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Safety

The safety of all attendees is our #1 priority. At all times, BSA policies, the “Guide to Safe Scouting,” and Youth protection policies must be followed. Scouts are not allowed to ride in truck beds or trailers.

Smoking, Alcoholic Beverages, Illegal Drugs & Personal Firearms

The Heart of America Council will not tolerate the presence of alcoholic beverages, drugs, or persons obviously under the influence of same, at any of our Council camps. Violators will be asked to leave.

Possession of controlled substances is a violation of state law and may be subject to criminal prosecution.

Leaders, please set a good example for Scouts to follow. Personal firearms, archery equipment, and sheath knives are not allowed at camp or on camp archery or firing ranges. Also, there is no smoking on the reservation except for in the parking lots away from the youth.

Campout Conduct

Please remember the Scout Oath and Law will be the code of conduct during this event. If there are problems that arise during the event, they should be brought to the attention of staff leadership.

Den Chiefs (YOUTH members of Scouts BSA) are encouraged to attend and can register with a reduced cost of \$20. Camping and Safeguarding Youth policies of Scouts BSA apply.

Event Highlights

- ❖ Overnight camping in Camp Piercing Arrow - Friday and/or Saturday. Campsites will be assigned upon arrival.
- ❖ Parking directed at the campsite. Please see Parking instructions for specifics.
- ❖ Overnight camping and all planned activities must adhere to guidelines outlined in The Guide to Safe Scouting and Youth Protection Guidelines.
- ❖ **Those camping overnight on Friday are responsible for their own dinner and Saturday morning breakfast.**
- ❖ A light snack, juice & coffee will be available outside the Piercing Arrow dining hall Saturday morning between 7:00 am and 9:00 am.
- ❖ All Activity Areas and Adventures for Webelos & Arrow of Light Scouts are included.
- ❖ This is an open program event. There are multiple activities, with many focusing on specific Adventures. Some will enable the Scout to complete a full Adventure, others a partial and still others are for fun and skill development.
- ❖ Each scout may choose from the entire suite of activities on Saturday, based on their individual or group preferences. Please note, this event is NOT structured to be able to complete all program activities. **To get the most out of the day, we recommend planning the Activities & Adventures you want to attend before arrival.**
- ❖ Activities run approx. 50 minutes, except where full Adventures are taught that may run longer.
- ❖ Commissioners & Staff available to answer questions and assist you.
- ❖ Camp PA system is used for announcements & bugle calls every 50 minutes to denote time.
- ❖ Webelos/ AOL will have a “passport” w/lanyard identifying each area, plus a form for completed requirements in the individual Adventure areas.
- ❖ Camp-wide campfire with staff skits, introduction to Micosay and more. Campers who go to the Campfire Participation & Micosay Overview area will participate in the campfire program.
- ❖ Prizes for the Webelos/ AOL and Den Chiefs will be drawn at the campfire, with ice cream afterwards.
- ❖ Activity Uniform (Class B): Scout T-shirt and scout shorts, belt, and socks if available. Otherwise, appropriate casual dress for the weather. No Field Uniforms (Class A) or attire.

Check In

Check-in will be at the Reservation Headquarters, located approximately **6/10 of a mile down Scout Camp Rd.** Signs will direct you to the check-in area. Turn right at the entrance and proceed to check in with our Camp masters. They will direct you to camping & parking. For Packs or groups traveling together, you should check in together to ensure campsites and parking together.

Friday night arrivals - Check-in will be available from 6:00 pm – 9:30 pm. Arrivals after 9:30 pm must check in with Sheila Lancaster in the Piercing Arrow dining hall first thing Saturday morning.

Please try to arrive as early as possible to help facilitate check-in, camp set-up, and parking.

Saturday morning arrivals: Check-in will be available from 7:30 am –9:00 am. Any arrivals before 7:30 or after 9:00 am should proceed directly to the Piercing Arrow dining hall. **Please try to arrive as early as possible, but no later than 9:00 am, as the program begins at 9:30 am.** There will be a lot of people moving around the camp, so **PLEASE** be extra cautious when driving.

Parking

Normally, vehicles are not allowed to park overnight in or around the campsites, as they are not designed for vehicle parking. However, we are making some exceptions for this event, recognizing many of you are new to Bartle, and we want to make it as convenient as we safely can. Please be respectful of our Commissioners who will try to get you parked as close as possible to your campsite. **All vehicles parked at the campsites must not be moved until after church services on Sunday.** Anyone wanting to drive over to “The Point” or into ICO on Saturday must park in the Union/Long Parking lot to avoid driving through the camping areas

A parking pass will be given to each vehicle entering camp at check-in. Please fill this out with your name and cell phone number in case of an emergency.

If you need to leave before the end of camp on Sunday, after unloading your gear, please move your vehicle to the Long/Union general parking lot located close to the entrance of camp. All cars should be moved or secured in the campsite parking area after unloading. For safety and security reasons, vehicle traffic will not be allowed in the camp after 9:00 am Saturday, until after breakfast on Sunday, except for emergencies.

Camping (Friday and/or Saturday)

After check-in, you will be directed to your campsite and parking by a Commissioner. **Your family/den will need to bring your own tent plus general camping equipment.** In addition, **please bring rope to secure tents to the platforms, which are approximately 9’7” x 7’9”, in case of windy weather.** You are also welcome to set your tents up in any flat area throughout the campsite. You may reserve tent platforms for others in your group arriving separately from you, but be aware, they may be asked to unload and park away from the campsite area, depending on the available parking. ***For this reason, we strongly suggest everyone camping together arrive together.*** **PLEASE DO NOT SET UP TENTS OR CAMP ON THE PAVILIONS. THEY ARE USED AS A SHELTER IN CASE OF INCLEMENT WEATHER.** Each campsite will have the water turned on and a latrine. Showers will also be operating at the Piercing Arrow pool shower house and the shower block houses. Those facilities include flush toilets, sinks, and showers. Please note the Block Houses have individual toilet, sink, and shower combinations.

Please remember, all youth protection rules apply while in camp, for youth & adults.

In-Camp Stoves, Campfires & Fires

Propane stoves and lanterns are permitted in your campsite. There will be a camp-wide campfire on Saturday night that all are expected to attend. This campfire will be the only campfire allowed on the reservation during this event. Individual campsite campfires, or any open flames, are not allowed in camp or tents. **Only battery-powered lanterns/flashlights are allowed in tents.**

Water

Each attendee needs to bring a water bottle. Water bottles can be refilled at the water stations by the latrines and throughout the camp. You may also want a container filled with water for your campsite.

Meals

Included meals are Saturday – lunch & dinner, Saturday night ice cream after campfire, and Sunday morning breakfast. *(A light snack, juice & coffee will be available Saturday morning between 7:00 am and 9:00 am outside the Piercing Arrow dining hall.*

Please help our volunteer staff by picking up and disposing of trash at meals – Thank You!

Saturday lunch and Sunday breakfast are Grab N Go. Lunch can be picked up at the ORTC (Piercing Arrow dining hall in case of weather) and breakfast at the Piercing Arrow Dining Hall.

Saturday dinner will be served buffet style in the Piercing Arrow dining hall. Sunday breakfast will be available in the dining hall.

Special dietary needs or meals

Any special dietary needs for medical or religious reasons **must be entered at registration in the Special Needs box.** Our dining hall staff will be happy to provide refrigeration if you choose to bring your own food to accommodate dietary needs.

Health & First Aid

The main Health Lodge located adjacent to Reservation HQ will not be staffed during this event, but there will be on-site medical assistance for emergencies and 1st Aid. Camp medical personnel will assist you with any medical emergency during the event; however, minor 1st aid should be handled by the Pack and/or responsible adult/parent. Please come to the dining hall, contact a commissioner, any of the Program Staff or Chris Bradshaw at 816.838.2183 if medical attention is needed.

- **Health Forms** - ALL persons entering the Reservation should have your current Form (parts A & B), to be retained by the Pack or responsible adult and accompany the patient in case of a medical emergency.
- ANYONE who is sick or has Flu or COVID-like symptoms should not attend. We will issue refunds if needed for those who don't attend for medical reasons
- Hand washing stations will be available at each campsite latrine, and hand sanitizer in the dining hall.
- For those that are uncomfortable in a dining hall setting, feel free to use outdoor seating. This will allow for additional spacing for those individuals who would like to spread out.

Severe Weather Procedure

In the event of severe weather, Camp Staff will be sent to the campsites or program areas to escort all campers to the storm shelters. Once the threat of severe weather has passed, everyone will return to your campsite or program area. Leaders will be responsible for ensuring everyone in your group is accounted for.

Lake Access is Prohibited

The H. Roe Bartle Scout reservation is located on beautiful Truman Lake. Our program does not include lakefront activities; therefore, for the sake of everyone's safety, lake access is off limits.

2026 - Program Adventures & Activities

Activities & Adventures are subject to change, due to weather and/or staff availability.

Activities are NOT structured to complete them all.

Recommend pre-planning the Activities & Adventures before arrival.

The bus will run approximately every 15 minutes during the day.

Open Activities

1. BB Guns – Location - Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Learn safe BB Gun handling, range commands, and practice shooting.

2. Archery – Location - Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Learn all facets of archery and practice shooting from various distances

3. Slingshots – Location - Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Shooting paintballs at downrange targets

4. Rocket Assembly & Launching – Location - Piercing Arrow BMX Area

Assemble and shoot a rocket, aerodynamically designed for reliable, high-flying launches.

5. Mission Possible – Location – Campsite Long - West

Your top-secret mission: Retrieve the Sheshebe Diamond from the maximum-security Bartle Vault. No easy task— as you must cross the Cobra Pit, make your way through shark-infested waters, and brave the horrors of Ghost Shark Isle. But the danger doesn't stop there! Prevent a nuclear meltdown at the Diablo Canyon power plant, avoid the black widow's fangs as you cross the Spider's Web, and finally, crack the code to Bartle's Vault. Will you be the first to succeed and reap the rewards? **8 - 10 people per mission**

6. H.O.A.C. STEM Trailer & HAM Radio – Location - Long Entrance - Flag Area

The H.O.A.C. STEM Trailer is a mobile science, technology, engineering, and math learning center designed to spark creativity. Inside, Scouts can explore hands-on programs such as software development, systems engineering, 3D printing, laser cutting, and etching, and they can also experience a live HAM radio station.

7. Scouting History & Museum – Location Handicraft Lodge Area

Webelos/ AOL will see “how actions of the past have influenced the present” and experience the history of Scouting and The H. Roe Bartle Scout Reservation.

8. Campfire Program - Webelos & Arrow of Light who want to participate in tonight's campfire program Location – *Campsite Dodge Pavilion*

Webelos/ AOL will work on making an instrument to use at the campfire as they participate with the Micosay Dancers.

All Webelos who would like to participate in the campfire program must visit this activity.

9. Adult Micosay Introduction – Location – *Piercing Arrow Dining Hall*

After dinner program –Introduce Micosay to adult leaders in larger groups.

Campfire – All Campers & Leaders – Location - *Piercing Arrow Council Ring*

Micosay Dancers opening our Campfire w/staff & the Webelos/ AOL who made an instrument at

the Campfire Participation & Micosay Introduction Activity Area. There will also be skits, songs, and a whole lot more.

Sunday Morning Church Service – Location – *Piercing Arrow Dining Hall after breakfast*

Webelos & Arrow of Light Adventures

First Responders – Location - *Piercing Arrow BMX Area*

Emergency Responder professionals display and discuss how to use the various vehicles and equipment within their professions. LifeFlight Eagle Helicopter landing and on site from 9:00am -Noon, unless called into service.

**10. First Aid - Arrow of Light Required – Location - *Piercing Arrow BMX Pavilion*
*Will complete requirements #2 – 7. Requirement #1 is a 22 min. video with parents***

In this Adventure, you will learn how to protect yourself and how to help others when they have been hurt. The skills you learn in this Adventure could help someone in trouble or even save a life. We have trained professionals like an emergency medical technician (EMT), medical doctor, or a registered nurse provide instruction for this Adventure.

Physical Fitness – Location - *Handicraft Lodge Area*

This Adventure teaches the value of healthy eating, regular exercise, and proper rest. Personal fitness depends on balancing all three. Food provides energy, exercise supports both body and mind, and participants will have the chance to join a group sport and activity.

**11. Stronger, Faster, Higher - Webelos Required
*Will complete requirements #2 – 4.***

**12. Personal Fitness - Arrow of Light Required
*Will complete requirements #3 only***

Hiking – Piercing Arrow Commissioners Barge

13. Webelos Walkabout - Webelos Required-

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

You'll learn how to prepare for a 2-mile walk, what you should bring along, and what you should do if there is an emergency. And when you are ready, take your walk!

14. Math on the Trail – Webelos Elective-

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

In this Adventure, you will learn how to estimate the time it takes you to take a walk. If you know your pace, you can estimate how long it will take to walk any given distance

Outdoor Adventures – Location - Ecology Lodge

15. Missouri Department of Conservation – Outdoor Safety & Wilderness 1st Aid

Introduction to the Department of Conservation and Officer duties, tree stand & outdoor safety, animal skulls & tracks, fishing, poisonous snake identification & wildlife management led by Missouri Department of Conservation

16. Into the Woods - Arrow of Light Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

In this Adventure, you will get to learn about the plants and trees in your community by exploring your area on a walk.

17. Champions For Nature – Webelos Elective

Animal Tracks, Skulls, and Fur – Missouri Department of Conservation

Will complete requirements #1-5. Requirement #6 is a service project

In this Adventure, you will learn more about the wildlife we share our planet with. You may put what you learn into action with a conservation project. Scouts will dive deeper into Missouri's wildlife by testing their skills in identifying various wildlife species of Missouri. This hands-on activity will allow scouts to look at skulls, tracks, and fur of animals to understand Missouri wildlife they might encounter at camp and at home. Descriptions of these animals as well as their preferred habitat will be provided along with the opportunity to examine the evidence they leave behind as they travel outdoors."

Fishing – Location - Ecology Lodge

In these Adventures you'll learn how to go fishing, determine where you will go and what type of fish you plan to catch, understand the environment where the fish might be found and determine the best type of knot to tie your hook to your line and tie it. Finally, you'll choose the appropriate type of fishing rod and tackle you will be using and spend at least one hour fishing.

This Adventure includes 1 hr. of actual fishing to complete the requirements.

18. Catch the Big One - Webelos Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure w/1 hour of fishing

19. Fishing – Arrow of Light Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure w/1 hour of fishing

Knife Safety & Handling – Location – Campsite Long - Central

20. Chef's Knife - Webelos Elective

Will Complete all requirements for this Adventure

This Adventure is required for you to use any knife during a Cub Scout activity. Even if you earned the Whittling Adventure as a Bear, you must earn the Chef's Knife Adventure as a Webelos to earn the privilege of using a knife during a Cub Scout activity. You'll also carve a neckerchief slide that can be taken to the STEM Trailer to be engraved.

21. Knife Safety - Arrow of Light Elective

Will Complete all requirements for this Adventure

This Adventure allows you as an Arrow of Light Scout to use a knife, with adult permission, during Cub Scout activities.

22. Art Explosion - Webelos Elective Adventure – Location: Handicraft Lodge

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure
