CAMP STAFF CODE OF CONDUCT

and Statement of Understanding **Under 18 - Parent signature is required.**

Statement of Understanding: All youth and adult staff are selected to represent their local Council based on their qualifications in character, camping skills, physical and personal fitness, and leadership qualities. Therefore, all staff members and the parents or guardians (if under 18) are asked to sign the Code of Conduct and Statement of Understanding as a condition of employment with the further understanding that serious misconduct or infraction of rules and regulations may result in discharge from camp staff. Ultimately, we want each participant to be responsible for his or her own behavior, and only, when necessary, will the procedure be invoked to discharge a staff member.

*** All youth and adult staff members are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct as follows:**

1. The Scout Oath and Law will be my guide while on staff.
2. I will set a good example by keeping myself neatly dressed and presentable. (The official Scout and staff uniform identifying items are the only acceptable apparel) throughout the entire reservation.
3. I will attend all scheduled programs on time and participate as required.
4. In consideration of other staff members, I agree to follow the bedtime and sleep schedule, unless otherwise directed by the camp program.
5. **I will be responsible for keeping my cabin and personal gear labeled, clean, and neat. I will do my share to prevent littering of the campgrounds. I will not permit unauthorized people to use my cabin or the staff area.**
6. I will not have or use cell phones, iPads, or personal computers in program areas.
7. I understand that the purchase, possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs by any staff member is prohibited. This standard shall apply to all staff, both youth and adults, on the reservation.
8. Serious and/or repetitive behavior violations by staff, including use of tobacco, alcohol, cheating, pranks, stealing, dishonesty, swearing, fighting, or condoning those actions in others, may result in immediate discharge from the staff or serious disciplinary action and loss of privileges, or criminal prosecution.
9. I understand that gambling of any form is prohibited and grounds for immediate discharge.
10. I understand that possession or detonation (explosion) of fireworks is prohibited and grounds for immediate discharge.
11. I will demonstrate respect for camp property and be personally responsible for cleanliness and any loss, breakage, or vandalism of property. I understand that I am **NOT** cleared to leave camp at the conclusion of the summer until my cabin has been inspected for cleanliness and damages.
12. The H.O.A.C., BSA will not be responsible for loss, breakage, or theft of personal items. **I will label all my personal items. Theft will be grounds for discharge.**
13. I will obey the safety rules and instructions of all supervisors and staff leaders.
14. I understand this **CODE OF CONDUCT** becomes part of my employment contract.

The bus will run approximately every 15 minutes during the day.

Open Activities

1. BB Guns – Location - Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Learn safe BB Gun handling, range commands, and practice shooting.

2. Archery – Location - Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Learn all facets of archery and practice shooting from various distances

3. Slingshots – Location - Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Shooting paintballs at downrange targets

4. Rocket Assembly & Launching – Location - Piercing Arrow BMX Area

Assemble and shoot a rocket, aerodynamically designed for reliable, high-flying launches.

5. Mission Possible – Location – Campsite Long - West

Your top-secret mission: Retrieve the Sheshebe Diamond from the, maximum-security Bartle Vault. No easy task— as you must cross the Cobra Pit, make your way through shark-infested waters, and brave the horrors of Ghost Shark Isle. But the danger doesn't stop there! Prevent a nuclear meltdown at the Diablo Canyon power plant, avoid the black widow's fangs as you cross the Spider's Web, and finally, crack the code to Bartle's Vault. Will you be the first to succeed and reap the rewards? **8 - 10 people per mission**

6. H.O.A.C. STEM Trailer & HAM Radio – Location - Long Entrance - Flag Area

This mobile science, technology, engineering, and math center gives Scouts hands-on access to modern learning tools and creative activities. Inside, they can explore software development, systems engineering, 3D printing, laser cutting, and etching, as well as experience a live HAM radio station. Scouts will also rotate through three hands-on workstations focused on aerodynamics, electricity, and sound. Activities include building a flashlight, seeing how electricity affects the body, and exploring how vibrations and frequencies move through the air and create visible patterns.

7. Scouting History & Museum – Location: Handicraft Lodge Area

Webelos will see “how actions of the past have influenced the present” and experience the history of Scouting and The H. Roe Bartle Scout Reservation.

8. Campfire Program - Webelos & Arrow of Light who want to participate in tonight's campfire program - *Location Campsite Dodge Pavilion*

Webelos/ AOL will build an instrument to use at the campfire as they participate with the Micosay Dancers.

All Webelos who would like to participate in the campfire program must visit this activity.

9. Adult Micosay Introduction – *Location – Piercing Arrow Dining Hall*

After dinner program –Introduce Micosay to adult leaders in larger groups.

Campfire – All Campers & Leaders – *Location - Piercing Arrow Council Ring*

Micosay Dancers opening our Campfire w/staff & the Webelos who made an instrument at the Campfire Participation & Micosay Introduction Activity Area. There will also be skits, songs, and a whole lot more.

Sunday Morning Church Service – *Location – Piercing Arrow Dining Hall after breakfast*

Webelos & Arrow of Light Adventures

First Responders – *Location - Piercing Arrow BMX Area*

Emergency Responder professionals display and discuss how to use the various vehicles and equipment within their professions. LifeFlight Eagle Helicopter landing and on site from 9:00 am -Noon, unless called into service.

10. First Aid - Arrow of Light Required – *Location - Piercing Arrow BMX Pavilion*

Will complete requirements #2 – 7. Requirement #1 is a 22 min. video with parents

In this Adventure, you will learn how to protect yourself and how to help others when they have been hurt. The skills you learn in this Adventure could help someone in trouble or even save a life. We have trained medical professionals to provide instruction for this Adventure.

Physical Fitness – *Location - Handicraft Lodge Area*

This Adventure will help you understand how to eat well, exercise, and the importance of rest. Personal fitness is a balance of these three things. What you eat is what your body can turn into energy. Exercise not only keeps your body working, but it is also good for your mind. You will have the opportunity to take part in a group sport and activity

11. Stronger, Faster, Higher - Webelos Required

Will complete requirements #2 – 4.

12. Personal Fitness - Arrow of Light Required

Will complete requirements #3 only

Hiking – Piercing Arrow - Commissioners Barge

13. Webelos Walkabout - Webelos Required

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

You'll learn how to prepare for a 2-mile walk, what you should bring along, and what you should do if there is an emergency. And when you are ready, take your walk!

14. Math On the Trail – Webelos Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

In this Adventure, you will learn how to estimate the time it takes you to take a walk. If you know your pace, you can estimate how long it will take to walk any given distance

Outdoor Adventures – Location - Ecology Lodge

15. Missouri Department of Conservation – Outdoor Safety & Wilderness 1st Aid

Introduction to the Department of Conservation and Officer duties, tree stand & outdoor safety, animal skulls & tracks, fishing, poisonous snake identification & wildlife management led by Missouri Department of Conservation

16. Into the Woods - Arrow of Light Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

In this Adventure, you will get to learn about the plants and trees in your community by exploring your area on a walk.

17. Champions For Nature – Webelos Elective

Animal Tracks, Skulls, and Fur – Missouri Department of Conservation

Will complete requirements #1-5. Requirement #6 is a service project

In this Adventure, you will learn more about the wildlife we share our planet with. Scouts will dive deeper into Missouri's wildlife by testing their skills in identifying various wildlife species of Missouri. This hands-on activity will allow scouts to look at skulls, tracks, and fur of animals to understand Missouri wildlife they might encounter at camp and at home. Descriptions of these animals as well as their preferred habitat will be provided along with the opportunity to examine the evidence they leave behind as they travel outdoors.

Fishing – Location - Ecology Lodge

In these Adventures you'll learn how to go fishing, determine where you will go and what type of fish you plan to catch, understand the environment where the fish might be found and determine the best type of knot to tie your hook to your line and tie it. Finally, you'll choose the appropriate type of fishing rod and tackle you will be using and spend at least one hour fishing.

This Adventure includes 1 hr. of actual fishing to complete the requirements.

18. Catch the Big One - Webelos Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure w/1 hour of fishing

19. Fishing – Arrow of Light Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure w/1 hour of fishing

Knife Safety & Handling – Location – Campsite Long - Central

20. Chef's Knife - Webelos Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

This Adventure is required for you to use any knife during a Cub Scout activity. Even if you earned the Whittling Adventure as a Bear, you must earn the Chef's Knife Adventure as a Webelos to earn the privilege of using a knife during a Cub Scout activity. You'll also carve a neckerchief slide that can be taken to the STEM Trailer to be engraved.

21. Knife Safety - Arrow of Light Elective

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

This Adventure allows you as an Arrow of Light Scout to use a knife, with adult permission, during Cub Scout activities.

22. Art Explosion - Webelos Elective Adventure – Location: Handicraft Lodge

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

Art is a powerful way to capture a moment in time, an idea, or an emotion. It's a lot of fun, too. You'll work with all sorts of gooey and gloppy materials and appreciate that everybody's art is different. Whether you like drawing, painting, sculpture, computer illustration, or photography, you'll find something to love in this Adventure.

23. Aware & Care - Webelos Elective Adventure – Location – Pavilion at top Tom McNutt Shooting Sports Range

Will Complete all requirements for this Adventure

Everyone has differences, and everyone faces challenges. That's what makes us human. In this Adventure, you'll learn about the challenges other people face by looking at the world through their eyes. The more you understand, the more helpful you can be — and the more you can show your friends how to be nice to everyone, including people who are different. After all, we are all different in one way or another. You'll navigate an obstacle course, visit with a person who works w/people with disabilities, and learn the Scout Oath in American Sign Language.

24. Build It - Webelos Elective Adventure – Location - Long East

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

You will build a small carpentry project. You'll also learn about the tools you could use to build just about anything you can dream up, courtesy of The Mid-America Carpenters Training Center.

25. Pedal Away – Webelos Elective – Location – O.R.T.C. Parking Lot

**Will complete requirements #1-4. Requirements #5 & 6 require a 5-mile plan & bike ride
AND Arrow of Light Required Adventure Requirement #3**

Get your helmet and your Cub Scout Six Essentials—we are going on a bike ride. Learn how the gears on a bike work and make it easier for you to pedal peddle. Practice safety and good maintenance of your bike, and it will last a long time.

26. Yo-Yo's – Webelos Elective - Location - Handicraft Lodge Area

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

The sleeper, over the falls, walk the dog, and around the world are just some of the tricks to learn with a Yo-Yo

27. Summertime Fun – Webelos & AOL Elective (Req. #1 – Council Activity)

Will complete all requirements for this Adventure

Anytime during May through August, participate in a total of three Cub Scout activities.
