Attention all Webelos Leaders, Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters: This is one of the required courses to be officially Trained. Youth Protection Training should be taken prior to this course but is not required. However, along with YPT, completion of both IOLS and Leader Specific training you will be fully trained. The completion of this course series is a prerequisite for Scouters who will attend Wood Badge as a Scoutmaster, Asst. Scoutmaster.

Don't spend your summer camp doing training!!! Get it done now!!! Anyone who will be 18 yrs old within the next year and all Webelos leaders who plan to crossover are strongly encouraged to attend.

Attendees will be organized into patrols. Saturday Lunch will be provided and patrols will create and cook the meal for Saturday Breakfast. This hands-on program gives adult leaders the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors program
