## **COMMISSIONER'S CORNER**



Greetings Pelathe.

As I'm gaining my bearings as your new District Commissioner, I wanted to say hello to everyone who makes this outstanding District work. I especially wish to thank all our wonderful Unit Key 3 members. I believe that Unit Key 3s are the backbone of scouting. You make the program work, you make a positive difference in the lives of scouts, and you are the most important interface between the BSA and all the families with youth in our units. You give up untold hours, treasure, and energy to guide our kids and therefore, our nation, on a better path. The commissioner service is here to help all of you.

Your Unit Commissioners will be contacting you soon, if they haven't already, to make arrangements to sit down with all Unit Key 3 members and conduct your first Detailed Unit Assessment (DUA) of 2019. In most cases, this should happen prior to our March Roundtable.

Some of you may be unfamiliar with what a DUA is. A DUA is a chance to take a breath and look at how your unit is doing and identify things you may want to change or improve. Your Unit Commissioner will conduct two of these per year and record them online in “Commissioner Tools”. This is how BSA tracks unit health. Your DUA will cover Training and Membership, Finance, Program, Leadership, Unit Priorities, and a potential Unit Service Plan. The Unit Service Plan is what your Key 3 and Unit Commissioner can work on together going forward to make any improvements you desire. You only make a Unit Service Plan if you need or want one. Additionally, your Unit Commissioner will visit your unit several times per year to check in with you and see if you need anything.

A Unit Commissioner's primary purpose is to help Unit Key 3s maintain top grade unit health. He or she is also there to help your unit access and understand District and Council resources that can

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help make your job easier. Don't suffer in silence if you're having a frustrating problem. Contact your Unit Commissioner. He or she will be glad to help.

Did you know?

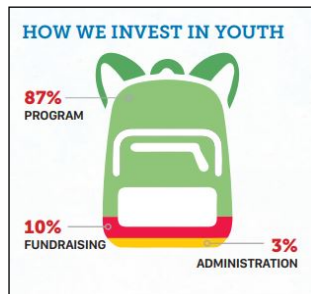

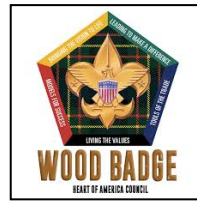

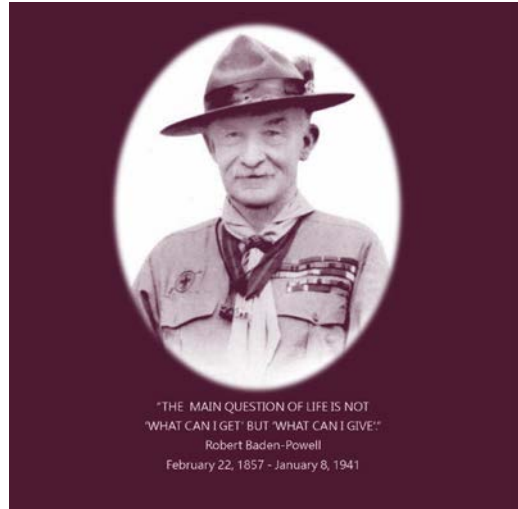
