

The Cub Scout Pack



YOUR CHILD IS A MEMBER OF A PACK WHICH

- Is made up of one or more dens organized by grade
- Meets once a month at the Pack meeting all Cub Scout families are expected to participate:
 - The Pack meeting is led by the Cubmaster
 - The Pack meeting is the highlight of the month's den meetings and activities
 - Pack meetings follow a suggested theme that have games, skits, songs, ceremonies, and presentations of badges that Scouts earned that month



YOUR PACK IS RUN BY THE PACK COMMITTEE

- Made up of den leaders, pack leaders, the pack trainer, and parents
- The committee meets once a month or more often if needed
- · Led by the Committee Chair
- The committee selects leadership, finds meeting places. performs record keeping, manages pack finances, orders badges, maintains pack equipment, helps train leaders. recognizes leaders, and plans activities

Special Programs



SUMMER CAMP

Tiger Camp: A day camping experience for first graders at Camp Naish. Activities include archery, swimming and hiking.

Wolf Camp: An overnight camping experience for second graders and a parent at Camp Naish. Activities include archery, swimming and campfires

Bear Camp: A two-day overnight camping experience for third graders and a parent at Camp Naish. Activities include sports. archery, swimming, crafts and campfires.

Webelos/AOL Camp: A three-day camping experience for fourth and fifth graders at Camp Naish. Activities include swimming, climbing, sports, and more.

New Scout Basic Needs



SCOUT LIFE RECOMMENDED

Scout Life Magazine is especially designed for Scouts!



With features such as camping around the world and hiking, hobbies such as model cars and boat building, bicycling, fishing and nature, and articles on current Scouting, sporting and new events, Scout Life has just about everything to offer your child.

Make sure on your application you mark the Scout Life square and put your correct mailing address. In approximately 2 to 3 months, your Scout will receive their first issue. This is one step you can take to make sure your child will receive a full year of great Scouting and a monthly reminder of the fun of Scouting.

HOW TO GET STARTED... BASIC NEEDS

Contrary to what your Scout may tell you, the first thing they will need to get started is not a uniform, but a book. The books in Cub Scouting are related to their age. Kindergartners will need a Lion Book, a 1st grader will need a Tiger Book, a 2nd grader will need a Wolf Book, a 3rd grader needs a Bear Book, and 4th and 5th graders will need a Webelos/AOL Book. These books contain the basics they will need for the coming year, especially the requirements for that rank.



CUB SCOUT UNIFORM

The uniform is an important part of the program and it represents an investment on your part. Our uniforms are of very high quality and, in most cases, will last for several years. So, be sure to buy one large enough for them to grow into.

Most new Cub Scouts will have to buy a uniform and our Council Scout Shop is the official distributor of Scouting America uniforms and equipment.

How Can I Help?



Scouting operates through volunteer leadership. Naturally, parents are the primary source of leaders in the Scouting program. You volunteer not only to serve Scouting, but also to help your child and their friends, and to have the chance to be a positive influence on the youth in your community.

WHAT DO I GET IN RETURN?

Being a leader is fun, challenging, and rewarding. Leaders find their experiences help them to become better parents. The following are some of the many dividends that will enrich your life as you dedicate your time, talents, and enthusiasm to Scouting.

- Fun and fellowship with other families, sharing your pride in the Scout's accomplishments
- The privilege of helping to enrich and strengthen families
- A chance to help Scouts learn good citizenship and to help shape them into men and women who have strength of character and are sensitive to the needs of others
- The opportunity to help make a difference in the lives of boys and girls as they grow strong in mind and body
- A code to live by which will set a worthwhile example for both youth and adults

Pack Leadership



DEN LEADER(s)

Leads the den at weekly den and monthly pack meetings. Attends the monthly pack meeting.

CUBMASTER

Helps plan and carry out the pack program with the help of the pack committee. Emcees the monthly pack meeting.

THE PACK COMMITTEE

Pack committee members perform administrative functions.

COMMITTEE CHAIR

Presides at all pack committee meetings. Helps recruit adult leaders. Also attends pack meetings.

SECRETARY/TREASURER

Keeps all records for the pack, including pack bank account. financial records, etc. Attends pack meeting and pack meetings.

ADVANCEMENT CHAIR

Maintains advancement records for the pack. Orders and obtains all badges and insignia. Attends pack meetings and committee meetings.

PACK TRAINER

Ensures that all leaders of the pack are trained. Attends pack meetings and pack committee meetings.

Leader Training



Training is an important part of learning to become an effective leader. The main purpose of training is to provide you with the tools you need to put on a quality program for your Scouts.

YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING

Scouting America places the greatest importance on creating the most secure environment possible for our youth members. This training covers Scouting's Youth Protection policies, kinds of abuse, how to respond to disclosure of abuse, and proper reporting procedures. It does so by taking you through situations that require choices and produce consequences. This training is available online. In order for an adult to remain a registered leader in Scouting America, Youth Protection Training is required every two years.

JOB SPECIFIC TRAINING

Job Specific Training is designed to present in-depth information for a new leader in a specific leadership position such as Den Leader, Cubmaster, etc. This course is presented several times a year in your district, at the council level and online




